Set in the 1890s the play's narrative concerns a group of shearers and their women who resist the conditions of a sheep station owner over the question of black-legging. This eventually led to a strike. Containing a trade union bite it introduces audiences to a number of traditional folk songs (and some new ones in the folk tradition) reviving within its story line songs such as "Click Go The Shears," "Flash Jack From Gundagai," and "The Old Black Billy." The title song, written by Kempster, is based on Henry Lawson's words. The "Ballad of 1891" was written by Helen Palmer (lyrics) and Doreen Jacobs (music).

The majority of revivals of *Reedy River* have been staged over the years by the New Theatre movement. With its roots in the Workers Theatre Movement of England in the 1920s and the New Theatre of America, the Australian movement was ideologically affiliated with the Communist Party. In this respect the emphasis was firmly on the class struggle, using the agitprop style of the Soviets.

New Theatre groups in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth, and later Newcastle, all mounted their own *Reedy River* productions. The groups would perform either in their normal venues or in various city, suburban and country halls. The New Theatre of Sydney estimated in 1959 that the musical had been seen by no fewer than 130,000 Australians, and by 1992 it was further estimated that some 450,000 people had seen the work (350,000 in Sydney alone). An English production is also believed to have been staged at the Unity Theatre (London), although no details have yet been established. *Reedy River* has been published by Heineman Educational Australia (1970) and by Currency Press (1989).
